The children continue to settle into Bush Kinder and discover new things to do on the site. We enjoy seeing how the site changes from week to week as many groups use the site and leave their mark with different cubby structures and movement of nature's toys.

There has been increasing amounts of tree climbing (riding the dragon) and cubby building. The staggered snack time is lovely as groups of varied sizes sit together to snack, talk and joke.

There is an overall feeling of calm and a relaxed pace to life that allows time for new thought and discovery.
